The Walworth County Arts Council awards \$2,000.00 scholarships for graduating seniors who are going to study one of the fine arts in college. The applicants must provide a high school transcript, three letters of recommendation, and a personal statement of his or her future plans. The student must also perform an audition and participate in a personal interview with professionals/artists in their field of study.

This year these three students received scholarships:



Ella Weerts, a 2023 graduate of East Troy High School is the recipient of the Walworth County Arts Council dance scholarship. She will be studying dance at Point Park University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Ella's first goal is to perform as a professional dancer in a contemporary or jazz dance company. The judge stated, "She presented a beautifully polished solo which featured the articulation of her torso, an impressive ease into her footwork, and a range of expression through the dynamics."





Alexandra (Alex) Martin, a 2023 graduate of Whitewater High School is the recipient of the Walworth County music scholarship. She will be attending the University of Wisconsin, Whitewater to study instrumental education. Alex looks forward to being able to educate young people on different cultures and music styles while teaching self discipline, time management, and more. The saxophone is Alex's instrument of choice. Her music teacher states that "the artistic side of music comes naturally for Alex, especially her tone concept and musical style. Her technical abilities are solid...."

After several years of being put on hold, the WCAC has resumed the bus from the Park and Ride lot North of Elkhorn, for the first time to the beautiful new Bradley Symphony Center in Milwaukee. All are for Friday morning performances, departing at about 9:30 and returning mid-afternoon (before dark). Dates are October 20, March 8, April 26, and May 10.

The new program offered some unique changes. Subscribers could choose from several different seating levels and preference for Orchestra or Balcony. This allowed a wide level of expense, making it open to just about everyone.
